THE FLOWERS

Members of the Cheam and Banstead Flower Arrangement Groups, Sutton Flower Club, with ladies from the Church will decorate the Church to the Theme of the Christian Festival of Whitsun, and its accompanying feeling of joy and praise.

Pedestal arrangements in the two porches will welcome visitors to a galaxy of colour, which will continue from the Church, through to Trinity Hall, where light refreshments will be available.

The clashing reds at the Communion table will be repeated by the Memorial Tablet at the back of the Church, whilst pools of tranquility, in all shades of green, will be seen on the windowsills.

The craftsmanship of the wood carver will be highlighted by the pedestal arrangements at the sides of the Pulpit and Lectern, and elsewhere white, cream and pastel shades will be used in varying attractive arrangements.

A unique pendulum arrangement over the Chancel steps will depict the cloven tongues of flame which descended from the Holy Ghost to the Disciples on the Day of Pentecost. (Acts Ch.2)
