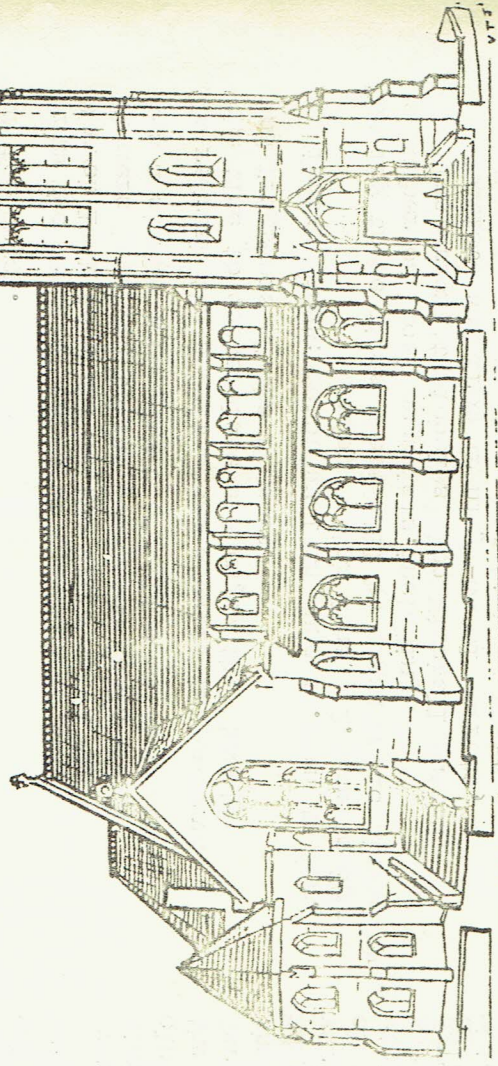

80th Anniversary Celebrations 13th/14th June 1987

THE FLOWERS

celebration of the 80th Anniversary of the church, the ladies of the church assisted by ladies from Sutton Baptist Church and ladies the Banstead Flower Club, have designed a floral display in colours predominantly orange at the entrance shading through apricot cream at the Communion Table.

The theme is The Life and Work of the Church showing a representation of the activities over the years. From Infancy we follow through Junior Church, Youth Activities into Adulthood. The varying attitude of the Church is shown by some of the organisations supported.

Music is portrayed by the lyres decorating the pillars. Two bass clefs adorn the Chancel steps whilst a treble clef hangs by the side of the organ.

From the Memorial table at the back of the church look down the centre aisle where the flowers lead you to the Communion Table which is a simple arrangement of lilies at each side. To refresh the spirit spend a while if you have time to contemplate and enjoy the beauty and fragrance of the flowers.

During these times there will be organ music played by a number of local organists, including Alan Green (St Nicholas) Ron Mitchell (Sutton Baptist) and from Trinity - Carol Garrett, Joan Dawson, Ian Dron and Richard Skeet.

THE EXHIBITION

The Exhibition of photographs and documents in Trinity Hall depicts incidents and personalities involved in the life of Trinity Church over the past 80 years.

The foundation stones of this beautiful building were laid in 1906 and on 2nd October 1907, the Church was opened by Lady Marshall wife of a distinguished Methodist, Sir Horace (later Lord) Marshall. The dedicatory service was conducted by the President of the Wesleyan Methodist Conference, Rev Dr J S Simon. Present on that memorable occasion was a young girl celebrating her 13th birthday, who is now a lifelong member of Trinity and one of its most regular attenders, Mrs Millicent Bastard.

Over the years some twenty-two Ministers have served at Trinity including, since its merger in 1973 with the former Congregational Church in Carshalton Road, three Ministers of the United Reformed Church. Memories of many of these personalities and of various events in the life and witness of the Church will be invoked by a visit to the Exhibition.

Refreshments are being served in Trinity Hall and there is also a Sales Table, which you are invited to patronise.
